

#### **Context is Critical**

Failing to distinguish one kind of domestic violence from another can:

- Endanger victims of ongoing violence
- Result in inappropriate responses by law enforcement, prosecutors and the court, advocates, and counselors
- Embolden perpetrators

## "Context" Means

- INTENT in offender's use of violence
- MEANING of the violence to the victim
- EFFECT of acts on the victim
- How this incident fits with previous patterns of behavior

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# What type of violence?

- 1. Pattern of violence with coercive control
- 2. Responding to or resisting a pattern of ongoing violence
  - Self defense (legal)
  - Retaliation (illegal)
- 3. Violence without coercive control

## What type of violence is this?
