#### **ABOUT THE ORGANIZATION**

Center for Domestic Peace (C4DP), home of Marin Abused Women's Services is a 38-year old, non-profit community organization working at the county, state and national level to end violence against women who are battered or at risk of abuse. Through programs - including community advocacy and support for victims of domestic violence, children and youth services, 24-hour English and Spanish hotlines, emergency shelter, transitional housing, support and education groups, community prevention and education projects, and a program for abusers to stop their violence - women, children and men gain access to knowledge and resources to achieve violence-free lives.

#### **JOB DESCRIPTION**

The Clinical Supervising Consultant will supervise a team of therapists who are providing group therapy for In This Together, a new group therapy program at Center for Domestic Peace. In This Together offers group therapy for child witnesses of domestic violence, ages 0-18 and their non-abusive parents and caregivers. Groups are held in English & Spanish and with age-appropriate brackets for children. This position will also assist with the design, development and evaluation of the therapy model to meet the needs of target populations.

#### **PRIMARY JOB RESPONSIBILITIES**

1. Assist with development of evidence-based therapy model for In This Together, a group therapy program for child witnesses of domestic violence, ages 0-18 and their non-abusive parents.
2. Provide weekly/monthly observation and supervision for therapists leading groups for parents and children.
3. Conduct professional trainings as requested on issues related to provision of group therapy for target populations.
4. Guide the design of the organization's therapy program, including required procedures for intake, assessment, therapy provision, evaluation, follow-up and referrals, with a focus on reaching Latino families.
5. Participate in meetings and trainings as requested.
6. Maintain professional standards of performance, demeanor, and appearance at all times.
7. Ensure compliance and accountability regarding organization's protocol for reporting and standard of care

#### **REQUIREMENTS**

1. Licensed MFT/LCSW required, meeting Board of Behavioral Sciences supervision criteria preferred, or PhD-level Psychologist.
2. Currently registered with the California Board of Behavior Sciences.
3. Minimum 5 years of experience as a Licensed MFT/LCSW working with at-risk populations.
4. Specialized training and experience in providing trauma informed therapy for domestic violence survivors and their children.
5. Minimum 2 years of experience supervising a clinical team of certified mental health/social workers.
6. Experience as professional trainer, able to create training materials (PowerPoints, handouts, etc.).
7. Knowledge of requirements for designing and implementing a mental health program.

8. Knowledge of procedures for intake and assessment, case management, therapy provision, follow-up, referrals, and linkages
9. Cultural competency skills and demonstrated sensitivity to populations with diverse values and norms, with the ability to bridge differences and build a common agenda among different cultures.
10. Strong communication and writing skills
11. Ability to work well in a team environment.
12. Excellent computer skills, including intermediate – advanced use of Microsoft Office 2010 suite and other computer programs.
13. Criminal justice clearance as required by the organization.
